# Why do we pray...

"Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness! You have given me relief when I was in distress. Be gracious to me and hear my prayer." (Psalm 4:1)

Prayer is one of those things that can sometimes feel contrived or awkward, and we find ourselves asking why we do it. But prayer isn't just about asking God for things that we need or desire. It's about establishing a relationship with Him, a relationship built on faith and the trust we have in Him. God knows the desires of our heart long before we ever think of asking, but He still loves to hear from us, whether we are asking for guidance or giving thanks, because it draws us closer to Him.

Scripture is full of people who were led to pray for a multitude of things that we still find ourselves praying for today, and that's why the Bible is full of verses about worry, strength, and hope. But for those dark days when we find ourselves questioning just how effective prayer really is, here are some verses that will help to motivate you to get on your knees - or as close to it as possible - and communicate with the Lord.

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"Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him." (Psalm 32:6) These lines remind us that our voices join with a multitude of others as we make our prayers to God. Occasionally, just like the Psalmist, we will feel that our prayers cannot possibly be heard over the vast noise of all the other prayers that must surely be flowing in. However, our faith allows us the confidence to know that we are in a personal relationship with God and because of this our prayers will be heard as clearly as if we were talking to God face-to-face. We are given further assurance of this when in Psalm 66:19 we read: "But truly God has listened; he has attended to the voice of my prayer."

Following on from our time of prayer is often that difficult and challenging period when we find ourselves awaiting God's reply. But once again we are assured that God hears our call: "But as for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love, answer me in your saving faithfulness." (Psalm 69:13) Wherever we find ourselves in life, we are welcome to come before God and talk out our thoughts, our feelings, our desires and our needs. It's not only possible at the strong times in our lives, but also when things get tough. Romans 8:26 reminds us: "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groaning too deep for words."

I don't know about you, but having grown up in the Anglican church, I've always found it useful to have the liturgy in front of me when I'm praying because it seems to be written in a way that phrases things better than I ever could. But the reality is that God hears our prayers no matter how they are phrased. So feel free to come before the Lord with whatever words you want to use, in whatever syntax you wish to use them. Flowery or ornate prose isn't necessary in order for God to respond. What is important is the recognition that we are in a personal relationship with God and that we can talk to our God through the prayers we offer.



- Cash: This can be put in the collection plate as it circulates during the Offertory Hymn. Cash is not able to be receipted.
- Bequest: Please speak with your advisor or trustee about leaving a bequest to the Parish.

#### Communion Practices at All Saints' Gladstone...

The last few months have seen us administering communion in one kind - the bread only - and this was undertaken as a concession to the pandemic; and as a way of safeguarding the well-bring of everyone at All Saints'. However, as with all things different, after a while there are questions as to why such precautions are being continued. Even though it is now discretionary, the Vestry have decided that, for the ongoing safety and well-being of all our parishioners, we will continue to administer communion in one kind. Should there be any change in Alert Level/Traffic Light colour, then this will be revisited and reviewed at that time. These changes to long-standing practices can be hard to live with after a while, but they won't last for ever and the Vestry is grateful for your patience and understanding.
