Into the Future...

While we await the unpacking of the recent work by Tony Gerritsen around possibilities for the future of All Saints' and the Invercargill Anglican parishes, I thought it might be useful to look at where we are at now and what we might be seeking to achieve going forwards. Right now most of us, if not all, are worried about some trends that we are seeing. The declining attendance post-Covid, declining outreach opportunities, declining giving, and a general decline in the outward effectiveness of the church. And most of us really desire to see these trends turned around. We are praying that All Saints' will be as successful and as effective as possible within our community. The temptation is to look for a quick fix, but I would like to suggest that there's another way. The need to slow down seems counter-intuitive at times like these. But the reason for slowing down is this: in the same manner that it takes time for any church to develop its problems, it also takes time to sort out solutions and apply them to the specific contexts in which they are required. It's all too tempting to attend a conference or seminar and to return with a one-size-fits-all solution, but that's not going to provide a lasting outcome. Such a solution may address the symptoms, but it will seldom solve the underlying causes. Another reason not to jump too quickly into a solution, is that churches historically tend to move slowly through change. Think icebergs and large ships.

So we have to take our time and do things properly. We have to ascertain what the solutions to our problems may be, and then we have to work together and with the specific issues to implement change in lasting and effective ways. It's no easy matter to ask a church to consider changing how it operates so that it can become more effective. Together we need to carefully discern the biblical mandate for what we feel we want to achieve and how we can get there together in line with God's plans for us.

One of the ways that this may be possible is to spend time focussing on biblical discipleship within a relational environment. This sounds challenging and new, such things are often unappealing because they are unknown and create a sense of anxiety. My encouragement to everyone is that we stay pliable, humble and teachable. We begin by focusing on working from the core outwards. Starting with the philosophy first, on why change is needed, then we can know why things are done and begin to adapt our thinking to the particular situations in which we find ourselves at All Saints' Gladstone. Secondly, we need some practical adaptation - first we know the "why", then we work out the "how".

Be encouraged that we aren't alone in all this. God always shows up and does His part perfectly. As we step through whatever unfolds in the next few months, God will help is to discern the biblical principals of the changes as opposed to any personal preferences. God rewards those who seek him, and we all need God's strength to draw us out of our comfort zone and into the uncertainty of change. So whatever your role in church, whatever your level of learning, and no matter if you've been a Christian for thirty years or thirty weeks, God will do something remarkable in and through you as we seek him in the future of All Saints' and the Invercargill Anglican parishes.

Last month the ladies of the AAW, accompanied by the Vicar, went to have lunch at the SIT Café housed in the Narthex of the former Saint John's Anglican Church. This building was deconsecrated and sold to the Southland Institute of Technology over two years ago and since then has undergone considerable renovation, seismic strengthening and modification. The old hall was demolished and a new three story teaching block was added on the footprint and connected to the extended Narthex of the former church building. Many of the original church features have been restored and maintained, and one can still see the font, the stained glass, all the pews, and the plaques embedded in the stonework. The new structural steelwork has been incorporated sensitively into the building to give it the strength needed to survive a seismic event.

Please use your name as the reference so the Parish Recorder can issue a receipt for tax purposes at the end of March each year.
- Envelopes: These are available through the Parish Recorder and you can make a donation using your envelopes. The amount you give remains entirely confidential and you will receive a receipt for tax purposes at the end of March each year.
- Cash: This can be put in the collection plate as it circulates during the Offertory Hymn. Cash is not able to be receipted.
- Bequest: Please speak with your advisor or trustee about leaving a bequest to the Parish.

Continued communion Practices at All Saints' Gladstone...

The last few months have seen us administering communion in one kind - the bread only - and this was undertaken as a concession to the pandemic; and as a way of safeguarding the well-bring of everyone at All Saints'. However, as with all things different, after a while there are questions as to why such precautions are being continued. Even though it is now discretionary, the Vestry have decided that, for the ongoing safety and well-being of all our parishioners, we will continue to administer communion in one kind. Should there be any change in Alert Level/Traffic Light colour, then this will be revisited and reviewed at that time. These changes to long-standing practices can be hard to live with after a while, but they won't last for ever and the Vestry is grateful for your patience and understanding.
