

Vestry Notes (continued overleaf)

Vestry met this past Tuesday evening and all members were in attendance. The Vicar has been invited to attend the Oban Presbyterian Church AGM as we are a contributing part of that worshipping community. Plans are also being made to hold a Vestry retreat day in February 2023. Wednesday morning Eucharist services will continue until the AGM next year when the provision of this service will again be reviewed by the parish.

Work on the Nine Lessons and Carols service has begun and an invitation has been sent to other churches for people to join us in the choir for this special night of readings and carols. Conversations have been undertaken with the other Anglican parishes about the provision of services at Christmas. All Saints is providing the Nine Lessons and a Midnight Eucharist, St Luke's will host the children's service, and Holy Trinity will take an earlier service on Christmas Eve. At present it would appear that only All Saints will offer a service on Christmas Day.
